# St. Patrick's Community School in Red Deer - Modernization

Phase 2 work is continuing to progress. We anticipate the gymnasium will be available to re-sand and refinish the floor in mid May. Planning has begun with regards to the turn over of Phase 2 in June and the start of Phase 3. We are currently a couple of months ahead of schedule and approximately \$1 million under budget.

# Changes to Montfort Centre/Cultural Services Centre

The present Cultural Services Centre on 39<sup>th</sup> Street in Red Deer, between Maryview School and St. Thomas Aquinas Middle School is currently owned by RDCRS and was operated by the City of Red Deer. The building housed RDCRS' administrative services up to 1999 when it was relocated to Montfort Centre and the City of Red Deer began renting the facility in 2001. At the completion of the Canada Winter Games, the City of Red Deer vacated the building and the space is in need of a renovation.

RDCRS operates their administrative office at Montfort Centre which was the original St. Louis de Montfort School. In 1999 when Montfort Centre was opened the student population in RDCRS was



under 4,300 students. Student enrollment in 2019 is over 10,300 students. However, during this time Montfort Centre has remained the same size and now is in need of a modernization. This modernization will begin following the completion of the renovation of the building on 39 Street. These projects are anticipated to be completed by Spring 2020.

The tender package for this project is posted on Alberta Purchasing Connection and will close in early May. Once tenders close and approved, we expect work to begin in June.
