Every September, many students and staff from across the division run to support Terry Fox by promoting health and wellness through physical activity.

This year marks the 40th anniversary of <u>Terry Fox's Marathon of Hope</u>. Many school communities are raising money for the Terry Fox Foundation by bringing a "Tonnie for Terry" and running around the school grounds.

With COVID-19, this school year looks a bit different. Schools will still join as a community. However, students will run in their cohorts at staggered times throughout the day.
