

- † Design a Catholic Education insert for your parish bulletin and school newsletters. Use pictures, statistics and quotes to paint a picture of your district

- † Personally ask a "keen" student, parent, teacher, trustee and priest to record their perspective on "Why I choose Catholic Education". Post testimonies on websites and social media

This picture speaks to both the beauty of the sacraments and the gift of Catholic Education. The link between the school and Church is vital!

- 100% of the children baptized (8 total) attend one of Christ the Redeemer Catholic Schools in Brooks
- The adult baptized is a parent of students at CTR Catholic schools in Brooks
- 90% (10/11) of those baptized or receiving the sacraments are either a student, parent or staff member of one of our schools in Brooks
- All Catechists were school staff members
- 70% of the Godparents/Sponsors were teachers from the Brooks' Catholic Schools



On October 10, 2020, groups across Canada simultaneously prayed for our country and the world! This year, Public Square Rosary Rallies took place on the Saturday closest to October 13, feast of the last apparition of Our Lady of Fatima and the Miracle of the Sun.

'Canada Needs Our Lady' is a special campaign of the Canadian Society for the Defence of Christian Civilization to win the hearts and minds of Canadians for Mary. For the past 2 years St. Michael's Parish in Leduc has hosted a public rosary on main street in the parking lot of STAR Catholic school division. St. Louis de Montfort of France was instrumental in establishing the public rosary and is known for his famous phrase: "To Jesus, through Mary."





