



At St. Joe's, I didn't just find a friend, I found a whole new family to call my own.


Our St. Joseph school serves 406 students in a K-9 school in the community of Mount Pleasant in North West Calgary. The current building has been in use since 1957, but we've had a school with the name "St. Joseph" since 1914. The original school was actually attached to St. Joseph church and was located about three blocks from the present location.

When I reflect about each school I went to, I guess what stands out most is that at St. Joe's an emphasis was placed on academics, but a premium was placed on service. How would I serve God? Never alone because I had a community of likeminded students to practice my values with. To quote C.S. Lewis, "It's not about thinking less of yourself, it's about thinking of yourself less." Shifting my focus from individual competition to pulling together to make a difference in someone else's life was a game changer. This speaks to the heart of who I want to be. I am proud to be part of the Jaguar Nation at St. Joseph School. No matter where I go or what I do, it is my second home and my favorite school. Once a Jaguar, always a Jaguar!

École St. Joseph School, Whitecourt




Our École St. Joseph School has an enrollment of 501 students and serves grades 4-12. We were blessed with a new school building in September 2017. The old St. Joseph School was open for over 50 years serving K-12 with many versions in between.

École St. Joseph School is a faith-centered school that integrates Catholic teachings at all levels. Our school fosters a strong approach to inclusion and to building a positive and welcoming environment. Our unique grade configuration provides opportunities for leadership and mentorship between students.

Our 2021 graduating class is working on a Grad Class Project to support local families that have been affected by the hardships of COVID. These initiatives encourage our students to demonstrate their faith at all levels by practicing the Catholic social teachings of Respect for Human Dignity and Respect for Human Life.

We are proud of École St. Joseph Schoo's well-developed athletics program and in the leadership opportunities with the Saints Athletic Leadership (SAL) program. As well, students can choose between a variety of clubs which promote active stewardship and creativity.

We are currently located in a new subdivision near the edge of our town and we love opportunities to use our fields and wide open spaces for outdoor learning and adventures. Conceptually, our building is very modern and open and encourages connections and collaboration—pre-COVID of course!

St Joseph School Red Deer Catholic School District

The History of Catholic Education in Red Deer and the St Joseph Connection.

In 2008, Red Deer Catholic Regional Schools celebrated 100 years of Catholic education. On October 8, 1908, the Daughters of Wisdom (Filles de la Sagesse) arrived in Red Deer to start St. Joseph Convent. The sisters came on the invitation of Father Henri Voisin, the head of the missionary order of priests, the Peres de Ste. Marie de Tinchebray. In November an application was made to create a separate school district in North Red Deer. On January 8, 1909, the North Red Deer Roman Catholic School District #17 was formally established. By February 21, names were on the school register.

Over the succeeding years, the school was expanded and the convent enlarged. The St. Joseph Convent School closed in 1960 and the boarding program ended in 1962. However, the convent continued to be a place of community service. In 1978, a new convent replaced the old one. In 2005, a decision was made to close and sell St. Joseph Convent. While an era had come to an end, the legacy of many decades of faithful service continues.

On Wednesday, September 20, 2017, St. Joseph High School had its grand opening ceremony. Located between the subdivisions of Evergreen and Timberlands in Red Deer, the school serves approximately 740 Grade 10-12 students.

Our students would tell you that St. Joseph High School is like a family. Our community has worked hard to establish a safe, caring and welcoming atmosphere. We celebrate diversity and welcome all.

While we are a relatively new school, students have had an excellent and fulfilling high school experience. Students have accessed first rate fine arts programming and participated in any sports they wish to. We have opened a Ball Academy supporting both baseball and softball players within Central Alberta. We have established strong traditions that students know about and look forward to (Grad Stolling Ceremony, Awards Night, Christmas Activities, Inter Varsity Game Nights and amazing opportunities to participate and celebrate our Faith (Confirmation, Holy Thursday, Advent).

Holy Cross Elementary School has a tradition of doing a school-wide Lenten Social Justice Project each year. In February, the school's principal, Mr. Will Baker, lost his courageous battle with cancer and passed away. As a school in grief, they decided to launch a fundraiser for the Haying in the '30's Cancer Support Society. This wonderful organization provides financial support to individuals diagnosed with cancer in the Lakeland

Typically the school raises about \$2000.00 for their Lenten project. This year, the students went above and beyond by raising \$5000.00! Each time a class raised \$50, a green ribbon (Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma) with the class name was put on the wall around the memory quilt created to honour the life of their incredible school leader. Staff and students from École Notre Dame High School (ÉNDHS) in Bonnyvile were also working on fundraising for this cause. They organized the Wildcats 2021 Virtual 3Km Challenge for Cancer.




Consecration to St Joseph
