

Option 1 Utilization Rate




PROS:

- Keeping together as many southside schools as possible.




- Splitting groups (Holy Family and Father Henri Voisin).

- St. Francis may not sustain continued growth before another middle school.










PROS:

- St. Lorenzo will have a high utilization rate.





- Splitting Father Henri Voisin.

- Southbrook perception of "leapfrogging" St. Elizabeth Seton and St. Francis.









PROS:

- Longer ride times from Deer Park and Rosedale to St. Lorenzo.









PROS:

Elementary Transition Breakdown (Option 4)







PROS:

- Transition from middle school to high school.


Elementary Transition Breakdown (Option 5)


Option 6 Utilization Rate
